Next, Gopher Broke with Jedd Dotson (Guitar, Vocals), Bobby Don Bloodworth (Guitar, Vocals), Bill Fleming (Steel Pedal Guitar), and James "Roscoe" Sargous (Percussion) join together to kick off the afternoon performances. Gopher Broke Band is rooted in Southern Appalachian folk, blues, and rock music. Group members have performed for twenty years and have performed with touring bands and are favorites in local festivals and venues. Fans are quoted as saying, "Wonderful music [from] a great band. It makes you wanna tap your feet and clap your hands. The best local band around!" This will be music to be treasured and enjoyed.

Carol Cain portraying Rosie the Riveter is a performance you don't want to miss. For the past twenty-four years, Carol has performed as Rosie the Riveter at the Little White House in Warm Springs, Georgia and other locations throughout the U.S. As Rosie, Carol dons coveralls, work boots, and the icon-

For her work as Rosie the Riveter, Carol has received numerous awards including the Little White House Carolyn Carter Award and the DAR Women in American History Medal. Additionally, her performance has been recognized for being the most innovative program. Carol is a "Rosebud" affiliate member of the American Rosie the Riveter Association, performs annually for the organization and was featured at events at Fort Benning, GA, World War II Heritage Days, the Atlanta World War II Roundtable, and the Atlanta History Center.
